Golden Grove, (Gelli Aur)

For almost 500 years, probably the most important Estate in Carmarthenshire, The Vaughans descended from the Princes of Powys, and settles in Carmarthenshire about 1480-1500, when the first mansion was built at Golden Grove. The Original Mansion was destroyed by fire in C1755, and built alongside the original. Earl Cowdor rebuilt the Golden Grove Mansion about 750 yards from the previous building in 1834. The mansion was occupied by US Air Force personel in WW2, in 1952 the lease was granted to Carmarthenshire County Council, and today it is part of the CCTA, and is now used as a college.
